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DATES: This course is a full day format running from 8:30 AM to 5:00 PM each day on June 12th, 13th, & 14th, 2018.


LOCATION: Strickland Building, 675 Strickland Lane, on the campus of the Maritime College of Forest Technology, Fredericton NB. The college has formal teaching and 'hands on' areas, as well as outdoor areas for practical sessions.

CANDIDATES: This program is designed for anyone who uses a chainsaw. From professional cutters to weekend firewood producers, all will benefit both in safety and efficiency. Experienced cutters, who have attended, have rated this course excellent and a real eye opener.

FORMAT: Topics covered in this course include:

- safety requirements & safe operating techniques
- maintenance & troubleshooting (a well maintained saw is a safe saw)
- filing & understanding chain design
- work technique including:
 - directional felling techniques
 - limbing techniques
 - bucking (crosscutting) techniques
 - bore cutting

The course is delivered through:

- lectures
 - discussions
 - videos
 - indoor & outdoor practical activities including:
 - filing
 - maintenance
 - directional felling
 - limbing
 - bucking
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FACILITATOR: Rod Cumberland will serve as instructor for Basic Chainsaw Safety, Operation, and Maintenance Workshop. Rod is an experienced lumberjack who was first certified as a chainsaw instructor in 1986 with Continuing Education at UNB. He has taught this workshop for MCFT (formerly Maritime Forest Ranger School) for almost 30 years, serving such clients as private landowners, contractors, Department of Natural Resources, Department of National Defence, First Nations, marketing boards, and many others.

Rod competes at lumberjack sports and has worked with STIHL, Husqvarna and ECHO on many projects, competitions and training programs. He is also a colour commentator on TSN for lumberjack competitions. Most recently Rod served as coach for the MCFT men's lumberjack team who placed first at the 2015 UNB Woodsmen Competition, a national event.

ENROLMENT: Enrolment will be limited to twelve (12) candidates on a first-come-first-serve basis. If your preferred course dates are full, or there is insufficient enrolment to hold the session, you will be notified as to alternate dates.

MINIMUM AGE: All participants must be 16 years of age or older. Proof of age may be required.

CERTIFICATION: Upon successful completion on testing by the instructor, each participant will be awarded a certificate and hard plastic wallet card that is valid for a period of five years.
