OVERVIEW: This two-day workshop has been created for both forestry professionals and

the general public. The course will focus on:

• Identifying invasive species,

• Economic and environmental impacts,

Learning how they can be prevented and managed.

Information will be presented both in lecture and field format.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Participants will gain practical knowledge and skills to be able to:

- Identify signs and symptoms of both current and potential invasive insects
- Installation of small scale trapping and monitoring systems
- Reduce the spread and introduction of invasive insects

CANDIDATES: This workshop is designed for:

- Forestry professionals, both industry and small scale.
- Individuals from the general public that have an interest in protecting our forests or their own trees.

COURSE FORMAT: Understanding and Mitigating Invasive Insect Species training will be conducted in an informal manner. Audience participation is encouraged as everyone learns from shared experiences.

FACILITATOR:

Sarah McCoy is a forestry instructor at the Maritime College of Forest Technology (MCFT) in Fredericton, NB, where she teaches 1st and 2nd year students.

She graduated from the former Nova Scotia Agricultural College (DAL-AC) in 2010 with a Bachelor of Technology degree in Environmental Horticulture.

After graduation she attended MCFT and graduated with a forest technician diploma.

Upon graduation she worked for the Canadian Forest Service (CFS) on a number of both native and non-native insect projects. She was recently published as a co-author in the Journal of Chemical Ecology for work she completed at CFS.

MATERIALS:

MCFT will provide all training materials for this workshop. Individuals are responsible to wear safety boots and a hardhat. For those that do not own a hardhat, we have limited supplies available on a first-come first-served basis.

ENROLMENT:

Enrolment will be limited to twenty (20) candidates on a first come-first served basis.
