**FACILITATOR:** Sarah McCoy is a forestry instructor at the Maritime College of Forest Technology (MCFT) in Fredericton, NB, where she teaches 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> year students.

She graduated from the former Nova Scotia Agricultural College (DAL-AC) in 2010 with a Bachelor of Technology degree in Environmental Horticulture.

After graduation she attended MCFT and graduated with a forest technician diploma.

Upon graduation she worked for the Canadian Forest Service (CFS) on a number of both native and non-native insect projects. She was recently published as a co-author in the Journal of Chemical Ecology for work she completed at CFS.

**MATERIALS:** MCFT will provide all training materials for this workshop. Individuals are responsible to wear safety boots and a hardhat. For those that do not own a hardhat, we have limited supplies available on a first-come first-served basis.
